Potlatch has also planted more than 190 million trees since

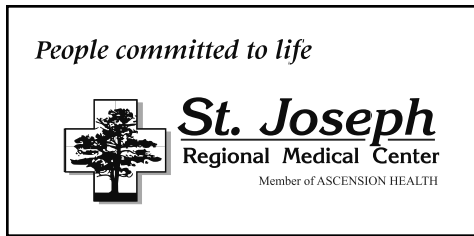


1990, according to the news release.

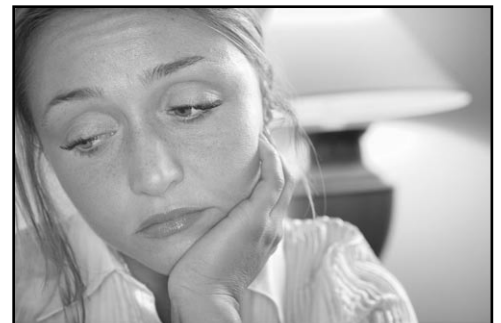

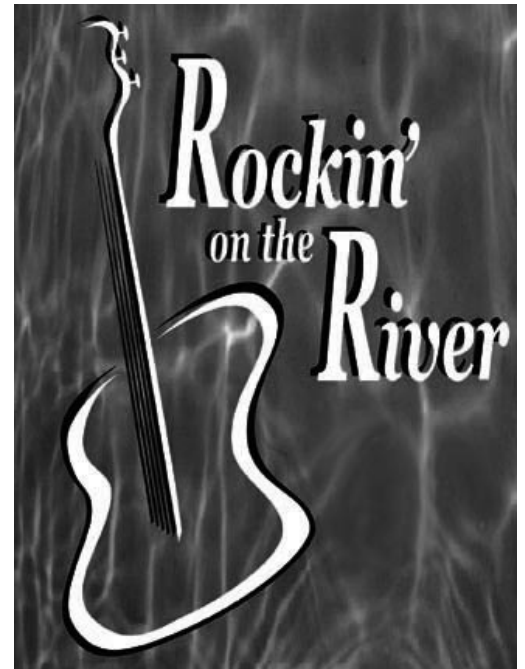
