Squirrel Appreciation Day is an opportunity to enjoy and appreciate your tree-climbing, nut-gathering neighborhood squirrels. It's held in mid-winter when food sources are scarce for squirrels and other wildlife. Sure, squirrels spent all fall gathering and "squirreling" away food. But their supplies may not be enough. And, the variety of food is limited. So, give them an extra special treat today to supplement their winter diets.

Not everyone likes squirrels. While they are fun to watch skirting around the yard and trees, they are aggressive at bird feeders. Squirrels tip almost any bird feeder and spill the seeds in search of the particular seeds they want. In the fall, they attack pumpkins on front porches in search of the seeds inside. For gardeners, they dig up and steal flower bulbs, and may eat some of the veggies in your garden.

When you think about it, mid-winter is the best time to appreciate squirrels. In the winter they provide a little entertainment. During other times of the year, you may look at them as a pest in the flower and vegetable gardens.

## Exercises for the Office

### Stretches for Your Wrists and Arms

*Wrist Stretch:* Extend arm in front, palm up and grab fingers with other hand. Gently pull hand down to stretch the forearm. Repeat other side.

*Wrist & Forearm:* Press hands together in front of chest, elbows bent and parallel to the floor. Gently bend wrists to the right and left.

*Back Twist:* Sit upright in chair and place left arm behind left hip. Twist to the left and hold, repeating on other side.

### Leg Extension, Hip Flexion and Inner Thigh

*Leg Extension:* Sit in chair, abs in. Extend left leg until level with hip. Hold for 2 seconds, repeat other side.

*Hip Flexion:* Sitting in chair, lift left foot off the floor a few inches, knee bent. Hold 2 seconds and repeat other side.

*Inner Thigh:* Place full water bottle between knees and, keeping abs in, squeeze bottle gently. Repeat.

### Chair Squat and Tricep Dips

*Chair Squat:* Periodically while sitting, lift butt off the seat and hover over chair for 2-3 seconds. Stand up and repeat.

*Dips:* Make sure chair is stable and place hands next to hips. Move hips in front of chair and bend elbows, lowering body until elbows are at 90 degrees. Repeat.

### Standing Leg Exercises

*Standing Hip Flexion:* Stand with abs in, spine straight. Lift leg up until level with hip. Hold for 2 seconds, repeat other side.

*Leg Lift:* In same starting position as above, lift left leg straight out to the side a few inches off the floor. Hold for 2 seconds, repeat on the other side.

### Front Raise, Overhead Press and Bicep Curl

*Front Raise:* Sit in chair, abs in and spine straight. Hold water bottle in right hand and raise arm up to shoulder level. Hold 2 seconds and repeat other side.

*Overhead Press:* Hold water bottle in right hand, elbow bent, and extend arm overhead. Repeat other side.

*Bicep Curl:* Hold water bottle in right hand and, with abs in and spine straight, curl bottle towards shoulder. Repeat other side.

### Abs

*Abs:* Sit on the edge of chair, arms extending in front. Keeping back straight, contract the abs and slowly lower torso towards back of chair. Hold 2-3 seconds and repeat.

*Curls:* Cross arms over chest and sit up straight. Contract abs and curl shoulder towards hips, pulling abs in. Hold for 2 seconds and repeat.

People young and old love kazoos. National Kazoo Day celebrates the joy of this musical instrument.

January  
**28**

Alabama Vest of Macon, Georgia made the first kazoo in the 1840s. Actually, he conceived the kazoo and had Thaddeus Von Clegg, a German clockmaster, make it to his specifications.

Commercial production of the kazoo didn't occur until many years later, in 1912. Manufacturing was first started by Emil Sorg in western New York. Sorg joined up with Michael McIntyre, a Buffalo tool and die maker. Production moved to Eden, New York, where the factory museum is today.

Kazoos are easy to play. Simply hum a tune into the kazoo and you're an expert. Kazoos can be played solo or in groups. It plays a great tune both ways.

What do you do on National Kazoo Day? Why, play the kazoo of course!
